Our next "walking" day will be **Thursday 5th December** when we will tackle **The Ultimo Experience**.

The full walk will be over 5 km, but the conditions are classed as **`easy**', with only a few steps to be found at the rail stations.



The name Ultimo was coined by surgeon John Harris in the early 1800's. The name celebrated a court case Dr Harris won by paperwork error where the Latin word Ultimo ('last month') was accidently used.



SCAM INFORMATION Be careful – people have lost thousands of dollars & won't get it back!

Phishing - don't take the bait! Phishing is a way for cyber criminals to get access to your information and accounts through unexpected emails, texts and social media messages you receive. Pause before clicking on links or attachments and **ask yourself, could this be a scam?**

Cyber criminals **might pretend to be** someone you know or a trusted organisation, like a bank or government department. **Before sharing** information with anyone, **check** they're who they say they are **by calling the phone number on their official website** or use a verified number you already have for them.

Take your password protection up a notchConsider using passphrases instead of passwords - they're a longerset of multiple words that are meaningful only to you.Use a mix of uppercase and lowercase letters, numbers andspecial characters.Saving passwords in a Password Manager app on your device may help, by securely creating andstoring complex passwords.

Multi-Factor Authentication makes it hard for criminals to break in Set up Multi-Factor Authentication (MFA) on your online accounts, including email and social media. Using MFA adds extra steps to confirm your identity when you log in, such as requiring your password and a one-time code sent by text or to an authenticator app.

Software updates are your superpower against hackers Regularly updating your software, apps and operating systems can be one of your best defences against potential security weaknesses. It's also a good idea to turn on automatic updates. Knowledge is your best defence. For more tips on staying safe online, visit **nab.com.au/security**.
